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- The long-term success of RMOAs depends on their effectiveness, predictability and consistency.
- Consistency of RMOAs is key to enable all authorities involved to take the most appropriate measures in protecting human health and the environment.



Publishing the existing RMOA template and supporting guidance would clarify the scope of the RMOA as well as enable authorities and industry alike to gather the requisite data for a swifter and more efficient process.

CLARIFY 1

The information required by authorities during RMOAs goes beyond what is required to be included in REACH registration dossiers. To prepare the information before the conduct of the RMOAs and to help speed it up, companies need to understand what is expected from them.

SPECIFY 2

RMOAs should include a public consultation, which would enable the collection of information at an early stage. It is a good practice to have follow-up meetings with respondents to the public consultation to clarify open questions and refine their understanding.

INVOLVE 3

The assessment in the RMOA should follow a standardised risk assessment framework, which can be included in the guidance. This would ensure that the risk assessment is done for the EU, rather than from a national perspective. STANDARDIZE 4

The consideration of socio-economic impacts would permit the assessment of both the benefits and the costs of action for the chosen Risk Management Option.

The absence of alternatives to the use of the substances should be assessed at least at screening level, as it may impact the socio-economic conclusions.

CONSIDER 5

A set of criteria that help in choosing the most appropriate risk management option, within and beyond those provided under REACH, including within other sectorial regulatory frameworks.
